Mark '+' when the horse has an edge in a particular area; mark '-' when the horse has a disadvantage.

After adding up the '+'s and '-'s, the horse which has the most net '+'s under Final View has the best chance of winning.


Assess recent starts and trends by reviewing recent form

From the Last 6 Runs (left to right), we can find out whether a horse:

- Recently won or finished in first-3 position.
- Shows any trends from their recent starts (improving or declining form).
- If a horse did not finish in a first-3 position recently, or his trend is getting worse, his chance of winning is lower.
- Recent starts should be given higher reference values.
- For horse debuts in HK, you should refer to his overseas records / pedigree / recent barrier trials.

However if you only analyse and focus on form, and overlook other variables, your outcome is likely to be biased

For example:

- Even though a horse has won, or finished in a first-3
 position, in recent races, he might not be able to
 overcome the challenge of a heavier weight or a rise in
 class.
- If a horse has not finished in a first-3 position in recent races, he might have been running over the wrong track and distance or started from an unfavourable draw.
- A horse might have a stronger form if his opponents in recent races have finished in a first-3 position after those races





2nd Step: Assessing other key factors

Track and Distance

Running over the best distance is a big plus

Each horse's speed, stamina and strength are different; therefore most horses have their own best distance.

A horse who performs well over 1400-1600M may not have the speed required for a 1000M race, nor the stamina required for a 2000M race.







Example: HOWDEEPISYOURLOVE

HOWDEEPISYOURLOVE has always finished in a first-3 position when running over 1200M.

This means HOWDEEPISYOURLOVE favours 1200M but his performance over other distances might not be as good as over 1200M.



Even over the same distance, our 3 different tracks have a big impact on a horse's performance

Performance should be compared over the same track and distance


Same track and distance consists of three elements:

- Same racecourse (Sha Tin / Happy Valley)
- Same track (turf / dirt)
- Same distance

A horse that performs well over 1200M at ST may not be as good over 1200M at HV because the two tracks have different characteristics.




Example: DAN ATTACK

DAN ATTACK has finished in a first-3 position over 1200M at HV track on 3 occasions in his last 6 runs, which proves he is good on this track; however, he could not finish in a first-3 position over 1200M at ST Turf track and ST Dirt track.

Even over the same distance, the horse's performance on different tracks can be very different.

So we should pay more attention to DAN ATTACK when he runs in a 1200M race at HV track.




Example: CHILL CHIBI

You can consider the horse's running style if there are no track and distance records for comparison.

CHILL CHIBI is a 'late-finisher' that always drop back to the rear, and then come from behind strongly in the home straight.

CHILL CHIBI performed well over 1650M with his come-from-behind running style; he should therefore be able to perform over longer distances such as 1800M.

On the other hand, he may not be suited to a shorter distance such as 1000M at ST.




Track Condition should also be considered

The condition of a turf track is described by the moisture level of the track surface.

Track condition is mostly affected by weather:

- Turf: Track condition is likely to be Good To Firm during dry weather or on sunny days; on the other hand, the track condition may change to Good To Yielding or even Yielding after rain.
- Dirt: Sealed is a new going condition. Racing like a Good Track Rating but with the surface sealed having not been harrowed in anticipation of rain to maintain surface quality. Track condition may be at one of two extremes after rain; Wet Fast which indicates a solid surface, and Wet Slow which indicates a soft surface.







Each horse may perform particularly well over a specific track condition

DRAGON DELIGHT: He finished 1st over 1650M at HV on Good To Yielding. However, he performed less well over the same distance on Good. Therefore, Good To Yielding may be his favourite track condition.

WINNING STEPS: He won over 2000M at ST Turf track on Good. However, he could only finish 14th over the same distance on Yielding. Therefore, he maybe unfavoured racing on a Yielding track condition.

The best jockeys can raise a horse's chances of winning

A jockey's competence can be reflected in their ranking, Win% and First-3%:

- Z Purton and H Bowman are the top jockeys who have outstanding figures for Win% or First-3%.
- The best jockeys can recover quickly from difficulties such as a wide draw, a knock, or being blocked during a race.
- Z Purton and H Bowman are the good jockeys who can handle horses starting from an unfavourably wide draw.

So do not forget to check whether there has been a change of jockey

If there is a change to a better jockey, this will improve the horse's chances of winning, vice versa.

It's particularly noteworthy when there is a change from a lower-ranked jockey to a top-class jockey like Z Purton.

Also, pay attention whether the horse has finished in the first-3 with the jockey in this race.





You can also consider trainers' performances on various tracks

Some trainers may perform well on particular track surface.



Do not overlook trainers who are ranked lower overall

Some trainers may have a lower overall ranking, but have good performance on their favourite tracks.



In general, horses starting with an inside draw have a competitive advantage

However, a better approach is to study the draw by analysing it alongside a horse's favourite track and distance, and its running style.



Study the Win% and First-3% of each draw over each track and distance

Inside draws for 2000M at ST Turf, 1650M at ST Dirt and 1200M at HV have a particularly high Win%.

This is because there is a tight turn shortly after the start, requiring the horses with wide draws to run a longer distance to get closer to the rail.










Exception: ST Turf 1000M Straight

Horses that start from an outside draw have a competitive advantage because there is less damage to the track by the Grandstand.





Impact of draw will be different according to a horse's running style





Starting with an inside draw has an advantage especially for front-runners

A front-runner starting with an inside draw will find it easier to lead in a race. This helps him to win.

However, if he starts with a wide draw, higher speed and more energy are required to get to the inside rail in order to lead. If the horse cannot get to the inside rail, he has less chance of winning.



CALIFORNIA SPANGLE can take up his usual role of pacemaker and lead this race. RED LION can take advantage of an inside draw and get into the trail. BEAUTY ETERNAL likes to race on the pace and he should get a good run just behind the speed. HEALTHY HAPPY might struggle to get across in the early stages and he may have to work to get outside the leader. LUCKY SWEYNESSE should get a good run one off the rail and in the small field will not be too far away. BEAUTY JOY should go back from the outside gate.

A late-finisher may have an advantage if he starts with a middle draw

A late-finisher who starts from a wide draw can still easily get closer to the inside rail and be restrained at the back of the field.

It's even better if a late-finisher starts from a middle draw (draw 5-10) because he will be less likely to be blocked and will more easily find space to accelerate in the home straight.



VOYAGE SAMURAI had led in all his starts and is stepping up in distance for the first time so he can lead from a good draw. FOOLISH HEART should be able to get across with his early speed and get into the trail. FRANTANCK is another noted leader however he has drawn wide so he may have to work if he wants the lead. He is more likely to sit just off the pace rather than get into a speed battle. KARMA has a wide draw so he may have to go back towards the rear of the field.

Watch closely when there is any change of draw from the last start



For lighter horses (body weight below 1000 lbs), it is harder to carry a heavy weight. So it is beneficial when lighter horses are promoted to the next class and carry less weight.



Example: BEAUTY JOY

BEAUTY JOY had not won in any races from 2023 Dec to 2024 Mar.

However, he finished in a first-6 position in Group One races.

He won a Group Two race in his last start. This reflects that he has an advantage over other Group Two rivals.


A horse's weight can reflect his condition



If a horse's weight has risen or dropped by less than 20 lbs, his condition should be maintained at a similar level to his last start. Therefore, if he finished in the first-3 in his last start, his condition should be good.

Otherwise, compare his current weight to his weight range when he had a first-3 finish.

If the difference is less than 10 lbs, his condition should be good. Otherwise, his condition might have dropped.




Example: SHINKANSEN

SHINKANSEN's weight in his last start was 1158 lbs, which had increased by 23 lbs.

His weight ranged from 1132 lbs to 1138 lbs when he had a first-3 position.

Since his weight is 20 lbs more than his highest weight when he had a first-3 position, his condition may have dropped. Finally, He finished 7th in his last start.



Do not miss the horse parade

Good

Body: Firm flat stomach, well-toned muscles with solid lines, and strong neck

Manner/Appearance: Calm, relaxed with eager eyes

Gesture: Sprinter – active and excited; Stayer – calm

Bad

Edgy with heavy sweating

Bucking frequently which may waste energy



It is important to watch a barrier trial performance

Positive symptoms:

- The horse finished the barrier trial after a relaxed run without pressure.
- The horse continues to accelerate after the finishing line, showing he has a strong desire to win.
- The horse finishes close to other higher-rated horses, reflecting that he is in top form.
- The finishing time is much faster than another barrier trial over the same distance on the same day, reflecting that the horse has set a high standard.

Estimate the pace of a race with a Speed Map








With the favoured runners drawing wide it looks an even renewal of this year's Derby. CHANCHENG GLORY has exceptional gate speed and he can go forward and get to the rail first. BEAUTY CRESCENT who was positive at his last start can let the speed go and get into the trail. HELENE FEELING of the horses drawn wide can be positive and get one off the rail. ENSUED can go forward from his wide draw and look for a position near the pace although there is a danger of being trapped wide. HELIOS EXPRESS may have to go back to avoid racing wide along with GALAXY PATCH.

Fast pace benefits late-finishers

In a fast pace race, front-runners run too quick in the early stages and burn themselves out before the home straight. They are then likely to be overtaken by the late-finishers who still have energy.



CAMPIONE has very good gate speed on this surface and although there are a few speedy horses in this race he should lead and set up a good to fast pace. XPONENTIAL likes to lead and although he is unlikely to hold out CAMPIONE he should be able to get into the trail. KURPANY is another noted front runner and he should be right on the pace. TRUE LEGEND is back in distance and he may be trapped wide. CHANCHENG PRINCE is also back in distance and he will be looking for some cover. FLYING ACE can let the speed go and go to the back of the field.

Slow pace benefits front-runners

In a slow pace race, front-runners can maintain their leading positions easily throughout the race and at the same time save their energy for a late burst. However, late-finishers have to run even faster than the front-runners if they want to catch up from the rear. Sha Tin | 11/05/2024 | 1:30 PM

MASSIVE ACTION looks the logical leader with plenty of early speed and the advantage of an inside barrier draw. ALACRITY can be positive from a good draw and get into the trail. SAMARKAND is never far away and he can sit just off the pace. WOODFIRE BRO is back in distance so he should be looking for some cover midfield. M UNICORN went back on his All Weather debut when he won and in the small field he can try to repeat those tactics and go back to the rear.

Other factors become crucial if it is a normal pace race


NERVOUS WITNESS has the best gate speed in this field and he should be able to cross the field and lead. TOMODACHI KOKOROE has the inside draw so he can let the speed go and get into the trail. WHIZZ KID is another speedster and he should be close up. PACKING TREADMILL can get an economical run three back on the rail. LUCKY SWEYNESSE has been slow away in his recent starts and with the speed in the race he may be back in the field. Last start winner FLYING ACE should go back from the outside draw.


